The Tour de France

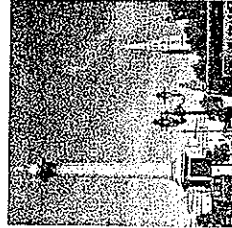
The Tour de France is the world's best known cycling event. It has provided entertainment for all and inspiration for generations of cyclists since it started in 1903. Then there were just six stages while today's race takes place over three weeks and 21 stages. In 2007 we can expect around 200 riders, 20 teams and thousands of journalists to arrive.

Each year the Tour de France starts somewhere different, although it always ends in Paris. Strasbourg hosts the start of the race in 2006. The Tour de France has visited Britain before. In 1994 two stages in the middle of the race visited Dover, Brighton and Portsmouth. An estimated three million people lined the streets to cheer on the riders.

The opening ceremony

Friday 6 July Trafalgar Square

The riders from the teams competing in the 2007 Tour de France will be presented in the square. The square, transformed by pedestrianising the north side in 2003, now welcomes thousands of Londoners and visitors every day and is the location of Nelson's Column as well as the National Gallery.
